INAUGURAL WINNER OF INDIGENOUS HOSPITALITY SCHOLARSHIP ANNOUNCED

Today, the Bridging the Gap Foundation in partnership with International College of Hotel Management (ICHM) and AccorHotels, announces Kenneth Abrook as the first recipient of the inaugural Indigenous scholarship, which was created with the Bridging The Gap Foundation for Indigenous students to study a three year Bachelor of Business (Hospitality Management) at ICHM.

Kenneth is a proud Kaurna man, ascending from country he and his family remain on in Adelaide. Kenneth graduated from Warriappendi High School in Adelaide, and has worked in hospitality throughout his time at school, sparking his passion for the industry.

Kenneth currently works with AccorHotels as a Food and Beverage Attendant at ibis Adelaide, and is looking forward to building his skills at ICHM.

“I believe this scholarship will arm me with the tools as well as the industry-specific knowledge and qualifications that I need to help achieve my goals in hospitality,” said Kenneth.

Kenneth is passionate about customer service and hospitality, as he has been working in cafes since he was 12 years old. His advice to others looking for a career in the industry is to be genuine and smile and say hello to everyone you meet.

“Always go that extra mile and be part of a team, make yourself known and work from the heart,” said Kenneth.

This is the first hospitality scholarship to be offered by the Bridging the Gap Foundation and the first of many to come.
